Some Clauses of Their Bill Struck Out by the Committee.

The Private Bills Committee considered a bill to amend certain acts relating to the Georgian Bay Ship Canal and Power Aqueduct Company, Ltd., or rather ex-Ald. E. A. Macdonald, appeared on behalf of the company.

Mr. Caswell represented the city of Toronto, and successfully opposed several clauses of the measure.

The first clause of the bill, giving the city the power to appropriate lands in the city south of the Lake Shore-road and west of Windermere-road, was, at Mr. Caswell's request, struck out.

A clause allowing the duration of agreements to remain indefinite was altered so as to read "for such periods as may be agreed upon."

The committee next struck out a clause providing that compensation for water-pipe rights might be returned in kind or by electric power.

The bill was reported, after being so further amended as to make the clause providing for the expenditure of \$500,000 upon the project within one year read "\$200,000 and \$500,000 within three years."

Hamilton Affairs.

An agreement having been come to between the parties concerned in the Hamilton Gaslight bill, the measure came up again before the committee and was reported without further amendment.

When the bill providing for the annexation by the city of Hamilton of a portion of the residents of the Beach appeared in the House, the deputations included the following among others: G. F. Jells, Walter Lindsay, W. H. Cameron, Peter D. Carr, Henry Judd, Charles Judd, T. H. McPherson, C. M. Council, William Bruce, John Campbell, James Mills, William Dixon, C. H. Leishman, Mr. Frank Baldwin, who represented the city of Hamilton spoke in favor of the bill, but the opposition was so strenuous that the measure was withdrawn.

Excessive Cost of Fodder.

The examination of Inspector Christie continued before the Public Accounts Committee. It was shown that during the past year \$4000 was spent in buying fodder for the 68 horses of the London Asylum.

This amount, as excessive, was objected to on the ground that so much fodder on a farm of 300 was obtained out that if the majority of farms were soon be bankrupt.

Successor Not Yet Nominated.

The committee appointed by the congregation of the Church of Scotland to select names to be submitted to the Bishop for nomination as successor to Rev. H. G. Baldwin, who has resigned the incumbency, owing to ill-health, has not made any recommendation. It is probable that the names probably remain in abeyance till the Easter vestry.
