Some Items Regarding Development in the New District of B. C.

The North Star company will soon start with large force of men. The contracts have been made with the Kimberly Lumber company for 100,000 feet of lumber to be used in timbering, and a large hoisting plant has been ordered. It is said that as soon as the railway is completed to the mine, it will become a nearly shipper.

The tunnel on the Little Mag is now in 820 feet, with a good showing of gold quartz. The lead is the full width of the tunnel, and the ore is rich.

Work is being carried on the Myer and Queen of the Hills at Morley. Every stroke of work is improving the property. A recent open cut made on the south ledge developed a 4 foot vein of gold.

The late rich strike of gold quartz on Boulder Creek has been the source of much excitement during the past week. The development of the ledge in the copper belt east of Fort Steele still continues to give encouraging results, and assessment work is being performed on the ledge.

J. McLaughlin has located two claims, the Gold Loop and the Gold Place, on the hillside north of Morley. There is an abundance of gold quartz on the properties, which are extensions of the Howe-Prince.

Interesting Mining News From the Rat Portage Gold Region. Rat Portage, Oct. 9. (Special.) Mr. W. P. Gordon, president of the Rat Portage Mining Company, has been here for two months superintending test work on the Hillside. He has about seven miles east of Rat Portage, extending northward from the Pine Portage road to the Canadian Pacific Railway. The owners are J. McLaughlin, J. W. Macdonald, and J. H. Hunter. Adjoining the Hillside property on the north side of the C.P.R. is the Winton Mine, on which development work is in progress. This property is owned by the Rat Portage Mining Company. The shaft being sunk in the Winton mine is about 100 feet deep at present in a vein ten feet wide. It is in charge of Mr. Gordon. THE WHISTLING NOISANCE.

A Parkdale Petition Which is Being Largely Signed to Have a Live Question Settled.

The subject of the petition is being circulated in Parkdale with the approval of the railway companies. Though the state makes whistling or bell-ringing imperative at crossings, jurists are often appealed to by counsel to overlook the statutory and to give heavy damages, because the whistle was not sounded. We presume a verdict given on the ground would not stand, but it is best to have the matter settled.

The undersigned humbly sheweth that among other provisions of an act respecting railways, Cap. 25, 1 Victoria, it is enacted that your honorable body may make regulations with regard to the use of the steam whistle, and the speed of trains in any city, town or village, or any portion thereof.

And, therefore, your petitioners humbly pray that your honorable body will pass such regulations affecting the use of the whistle as would be considered by the Railway Act, causing the use with a whistle to be entirely dispensed with and that such order may be entered in the premises as to your honorable body may seem fit, and your petitioners will ever pray, etc.
