#### LONDON PATRIOTIC FUND HAS CARE OF **OVER 800 FAMILIES**

Twelve Thousand Dollars Distributed in February.

**DONATIONS GO TO OTTAWA** 

Monies for Local Distribution Are Requisitioned Each Month.

Not one cent of the money collected in a patriotic fund campaign in this city is actually handled by the London Patriotic Fund Association. As soon Patrictic Fund Association. As soon as collected subscriptions are immediately forwarded to Ottawa to the Canadian Patrictic Fund, of which Sir Thomas White is treasurer, the local organization requisitioning each month the amount required to meet allowances to beneficiaries and other expenses.

Not once since affiliated with the Canadian Patriotic Fund in April of 916 has the London association been beliged to make an overdraft over the nonies requisitioned, notwithstanding monies requisitioned, notwithstanding the long list of its beneficiaries. From April, 1916, until the close of February this year, the amount of money administered by the London association has been \$254,286.42. Probably no business firm in the city holds such a record for economic management as the London Patriotic Association. The cost of administration averages just 1.29 per cent of the total turnover, an object lesson in wartime thrift.


