This was sufficient to bring him within the shadow of the scaffold. He was condemned to death, and would have been hanged had his sentence not been commuted.

Apart from direct methods of committing lese majeste in England-and the foregoing does not by any means exhaust the list-the unwary subjects can be guilty of the offense in a more roundabout way.

It is lese majeste to bring the King's uniform into contempt. Members of theatrical companies who have appeared on form a grewsome private museum. the stage as comic character attired in Buddhist praying wheel, the skull of discarded military or naval uniforms Dyak warrior, Dyak shields adorned have occasionally been unpleasantly re-with hair from the scalps of enemies minded of this fact.
