> ST. THOMAS, Nov. 16 .- A conscientious objector who is a Christadelphian, has been refused exemption by one of the St. Thomas tribunals. The applicant was quite indignant about the dismissal of his case. He stated that the commandment "Thou shalt not kill" is bound to be obeyed by his sect of religion and that he will not fight under any consideration.

> "I will go to Jail for twenty years, a or a life term, if they wish, but they cannot send me to the front. I would stand against a wall and be shot, but I will not kill," he declared vehemently. The man came to Canada from England, and several times was approached by recruiting officers, but on each occasion he positively refused to join the army, and on one such visit, he threatened to call the police if the officers insisted upon molesting him.
