

PROTEST AGAINST BEER.

Hundred of Thousands in Unique Lon-don Demonstration. LONDON July 25.-Hyde Park,

which has been the scene of so many remarkable demonstrations this year, was invaded again this evening by a gigantic concourse that demonstrated its support of the government's licens-

ing bill. The estimates of the crowd vary from 300,000 to half a million. It was made up mostly of the members of temperance societies from all parts of London and the suburbs. There were 120 speakers, including such men as Winston S. Churchill, Dr. Clifford, Lord Kennaird and a number of members of the house of commons. One hundred bands enlivened the pro-ceedings, and there was a remarkable

scene when, at a given signal, they all struck up the hymn, "Onward Christian Soldiers," in which the de-monstrators joined. The proceedings came to an end with the passing of a resolution de-manding that both houses of parlia-ment pass the bill without delay.


