WILL FILTER THE AIR

French Inventor's Scheme For Purifying the Atmosphere.

PARIS, Aug. 22.—That distinguished physiologist, Prof. Charles Richet of the Academy of Medicine, has this past week given the particulars of an invention which he recently submitted to his colleagues for the purification of air in rooms.

He has contrived an apparatus called an air filter. The principle on which it is based is the method adopted by certain physiologists and notably by Director Mont-Souris of the Observatoire de Miquel for determining the number of germs contained in the air.

Prof. Richet's air filter consists of a small ventilator worked by electricity which displaces about 200 cubic meters of air an hour. Beneath the fans of the ventilator is a reservoir of glycerin.

The rotation of the fans scatters the glycerin in fine drops along the walls of the cylinder containing the ventilator and the air particles constantly come into contact with the little circuit of liquid particles which carry with them as they fall the germs, dust, microbes, and spores always found in the air.

The mechanical sterilization of air in this method is a kind of laboratory imitation of the vast purification of the atmosphere caused by a heavy rainfall. Prof. Richet thinks the general use of his apparatus would materially diminish the risks of contagion by the germs of scarlatina, smallpox, and consumption.

THIS SHAMFIGHT NO HOLIDAY

New York State Volunteers Complain of Ill-Usage.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—Back from the capture of Boston the New York soldiers yesterday complained of the treatment of the Puritan and Pilgrim and hastened with some grumbling for the nearest food, drink and bath tubs.

While Colonel Daniel Appleton, of the Seventh New York, and other officers asserted cheerfully that the war game has been one grand picnic for the men and that all had gone well despite the weather, the men in the ranks had several things to say about long hours and the lack of food and drink.

Particularly dissatisfied were the men of the signal corps, who told of men going to sleep in the saddle after working twenty hours out of twenty-four, while from the enlisted men came a wall that while plenty of food had been provided in advance the commissary could not keep up to the fighting columns which waded night and day thru Massachusetts mud. Massachusetts towns were dry deserts with no oases in sight.

POLICE TOO ROUGH?

Two Montreal Constables Must Explain Drunken Man's Death.

MONTREAL, Aug. 22.—Two policemen are to answer in the courts for the death of a drunken man under their charge. Ernest Racine was picked up drunk and taken to East Craig station by Constables Lemieux and Brown. They were taking him to the basement to the cells when he fell to the bottom and broke his skull. He was giving them considerable trouble, and they will be closely questioned as to whether he was pushed or fell.
