

The second resolution was moved by the co-adjutor Bishop of Newfoundland, and seconded by Peter Lynch, Esq.,—

"That one distinctive mark which our blessed Master has set upon His Church is its Missionary character, and it is, therefore, our imperative duty, while we deplore our past neglect, to labor more and more diligently to maintain that character for the time to come."

The third resolution was moved by the Rev. J. C. Edghill, and seconded by the Rev. G. W. Hodgson,—

"That while recognizing the Divine command to spread the Gospel abroad, we are aware of the pressing necessity of supporting our Church at home, and that this necessity lays upon all the members of the Society the solemn obligation to abound more and more in their liberality and devotion to her special work in this Diocese."

After the collection the hymn "Onward, Christian soldiers," was sung. The thanks of the meeting were tendered by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop, and given by acclamation, to his Excellency for his kindness in presiding.

The Bishop dismissed the meeting with the Benediction.
