County Policeman Saunders, arrested an eighteen-year-old girl early Saturday morning in Marsh road. She is charged with not being able to give a satisfactory account of herself.

William Thompson & Co., Ltd., local agents for the Manchester line, were advised by wire yesterday that the captain and crew of the steamship Manchester Inventor have been saved. She was reported as being sunk on January 18, while on her way from St. John.

Rev. A. L. Fleming preached a striking sermon to his congregation in St. John (Stone) church yesterday morning. He deplored the fact that while the Empire is fighting for its life the people of Canada, "as a whole, are spending more money than ever before."

On Saturday evening, the members of the Acme and Warrior Bible study groups of the Y. M. C. A. gathered for a banquet, which was followed by an informal talk on the three C's, Lieutenant W. D. McKay, of the Field Ambulance Depot, gave the second of a series of First Aid lectures. Yesterday morning A. F. Blake delivered the third address on the Christian race.

Detectors Barrett and Duncan, County Policemen, Saunders and Policeman McAlinsh paid a visit to a house near the Municipal Home on the Red Head Road at 12:30 a. m. Sunday. Several arrests were made as a result. James Peacock was charged with being the proprietor of a disorderly house; his daughters and two young men are charged with being inmates. Three small boys were also found in the house. The wife and mother has not been living with the rest of the family for some time.

With almost complete unanimity the members of the chain gang are bemoaning the loss of their daily exercise, their tobacco and one square meal a day. When the county council voted the gang out of existence the men not only lost their systematic exercise but they also had to sacrifice their daily allowance of tobacco and an extra good meal of whole-some beef.

The Returned Soldiers Aid Committee, Bulletin, issued in Ottawa, has the following under December date:—New Brunswick "Returned Soldiers Aid Committee, 40 Canterbury street, St. John, Thomas Bell, chairman; C. Robinson, secretary. "December 10—Returned, 325; working for government, forty; in ordinary employment, 125; on guard duty, etc., forty-two. Refused positions, but working temporarily, thirty-five; not qualified for positions offered, fifty; unemployed in St. John, five. Nearly all the discharged men are doing some kind of work. The secretary adds that the government and city and all corporations are giving preference to returned men.

"The New Brunswick commission has recently undertaken a vigorous organizing campaign, and it is probable that in the near future there will be local welcome and employment committees in every important centre in Moncton there is an excellent welcome committee, which meets the trains passing through from Halifax or St. John to Quebec. Much attention has been expressed of the kindly attention given by the people of Moncton.

FRANCE AND ITALY NEED COAL Activities of Submarine Make Serious Inroads on the Supply. Washington, Jan. 22—Destruction of allied merchant ships by submarines is making the ocean transportation problem in the Entente countries so acute, according to official dispatches received here that even the fixing maximum rates on coal transportation has failed to relieve the coal shortage in France and Italy. Neutral vessels are refusing to carry coal from British ports to the allied countries because neutral ports offer better rates.
