



PORTLAND, Me., Nov. 9—Coast-guard patrol boat CG-151 opened fire today on a suspected rum-runner which proved to be an army steamer loaded with two tons of explosive powder. Two one-pound shells passed close to the army craft before its signals were recognized.

Army boat, the United States quartermaster's steamer L-49, had a deckload of cases of powder, which attracted the attention of the patrol craft.

As the army vessel swung off, the CG-151 started in pursuit. Not realizing that the vessel was being pursued the L-49 put on speed and the firing began. Frantic signals were made by the army men as the shells whizzed overhead. The commander of the patrol boat explained his action by saying: "It looked very bad with cases piled on deck and you running away from a coastguard boat."






