TAX COMMISSIONER FOR CITY IS DEAD

Enoch W. Paul Passes Away—Was Well Known Painter.

One of the best known citizens of the city passed away last night at his home, 48 Hazen street, in the person of Enoch W. Paul. A life long resident of the city Mr. Paul took a keen interest in civic and community matters and this brought him in touch with the public to a large extent. For many years he conducted business as a master painter, retiring about ten years ago. Since that time he has been engaged as one of the district commissioners under the city assessment act.

For thirty-five years he was the secretary-treasurer of the Log Cabin

Fishing Club. He was a director and vice-president of the Open House Company and a member of New Brunswick Lodge, No. 22, F. & A. M. He was a Methodist in religion and attended Centenary church. Although he had been seriously ill his death came suddenly and unexpectedly.

Besides his wife he is survived by one brother, John, in the United States, and an adopted daughter, Mrs. Herbert Downie, at home.

REGRET DEATH OF W. F. HATHEWAY

Fortnightly Club Pays Tribute to His Literary Ability.

The Fortnightly Club at its meeting on Monday night passed a resolution of regret in the death of W. Franklin Hatheway, to whom it was felt, more than to any one else, was due the credit for the organization of the club 25 years ago. The resolution stated that in the organization and early years of the club Mr. Hatheway took a leading part, and throughout the whole period of its existence he continued to be regarded as its strongest supporter. By his real and enthusiasm he inspired the members with the feeling that the preparation and discussion of papers bearing on literature and current events were productive not only of broad mental culture, but also of a readiness and clearness of expression in speech and writing. The resolution referred to Mr. Hatheway's wide and accurate knowledge based on extensive reading, his originality and breadth of viewpoint, his force and clearness of diction and his aptitude in quoting from the best English writers. The club recalled Mr. Hatheway as it had known him best, as a congenial member, seeking to encourage others. His death was felt as a great loss and his memory would be held in deep and lasting affection. The resolution closed by extending sympathy to the bereaved relatives.
