



Uses Only Human Power to Send Up Machine.

Paris, June 22.—Successful flight in an airplane operated by foot has been un-officially credited to Gabriel Poulan, a noted French bicyclist. The feat was accomplished in official tests for the Peugeot prize of 10.000 francs to the first person to succeed in leaving the ground and flying ten meters with only human power


