SCIENTIST ENDS LIFE MOST DRAMATICALLY
London, Jan. 15.—Composing his own lethal gas, Constantine de Mereshevsky, a chemist and biologist of international repute, former professor in the University of Petrograd, committed suicide in a Geneva hotel under dramatic circumstances.

Mereshkevsky escaped from Russia with a small fortune, which was exhausted after two years' residence in Geneva, where he continued his research work and wrote scientific books. When his funds were gone he was too proud to appeal for help. He preferred to die. He scrupulously paid all his debts and then mixed a special composition in a receptacle to which he attached a tube. Then binding himself to the bed released the gas which was given off from the composition. He died from asphyxiation. Firemen had to wear smoke helmets to remove the body from the room.

Pension for Grandmothers.
The Elgin County, Ont., Mothers' Alliance Commission has resolved that the Mothers' Allowance Act be amended so as to provide pensions for grandmothers entrusted with the care of small children, and that they be placed on the same footing as mothers. The county commission has been appealed to for help by a number of grandmothers who have taken the place of mothers in the maintenance and protection of little ones.

At a meeting of the King's Daughters held yesterday plans were formed to hold a tea and sale, and committees were appointed to look after necessary arrangements.

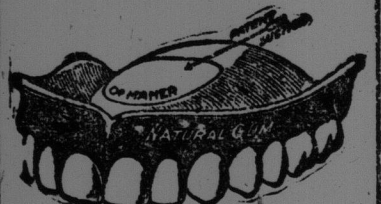

Petitions asking the government to close this block of land to all settlement and to place in it an adequate staff of wardens to protect the deer and moose, are in circulation and have been widely signed. It is argued that the overflow from the preserve would make game animals more numerous in the province.
A considerable revenue flows into the coffers of New Brunswick each year because of the "good hunting" in her forests. In the season just over 1916 moose were slaughtered in the province. This was about 125 fewer than in 1915. In 1920, 2400 deer were killed, about the same number as in the previous season. The game wardens have of late been
