Tokio, April 19.—(By the Associated Press)—Special despatches from Korea state that members of the Christian mission at Teigwan, near Seoul, clashed with gendarmes during a riot there, the officers firing upon the mob, killing twenty and wounding many of those engaged in the demonstration.

SEND HORSES TO EUROPE TO HELP FEED THE POOR
Pierre, S. D., April 21.—A corporation to dispose of light animals to European dealers in horse meat has been formed by South Dakota horse dealers.
For many years light horses have been of little value to South Dakota ranchers. The plan is said to have been discussed at Washington as one means of providing the poorer classes in continental Europe with meat. Those behind the corporation say the American market has shown little interest in the horse meat industry.
