#### THIRTEEN THOUSAND VOTERS

Thirteen thousand and eighty-nine voters are on the list at the present time for the coming civic elections, though this number will, in all probability, suffer considerable reduction before the election day, as those who have not paid their taxes by March 16, three weeks before the day of nomination, will have their names struck off the lists. The largest ward is Prince, with 1872 voters, Stanley being the smallest, with 292.

Additional polling booths will be opened in several of the wards this year and the polls will remain open till 6 p. m.

Asked this morning with reference to the complaints as regards the mis-connection of the late Boston train with the Halifax, last night, L. R. Ross, I.C.R. terminal agent, said that what was done was similar to what would be done by any other road, and was only in accordance with regular railway doctrine. "In the first place," said Mr. Ross, "the early Boston train is not held by the C. P. R. any more than half an hour should the early Halifax train be late. This same rule applies to No. 10 train with regard to the half hour wait. Because of the delay to the Boston, the I. C.
