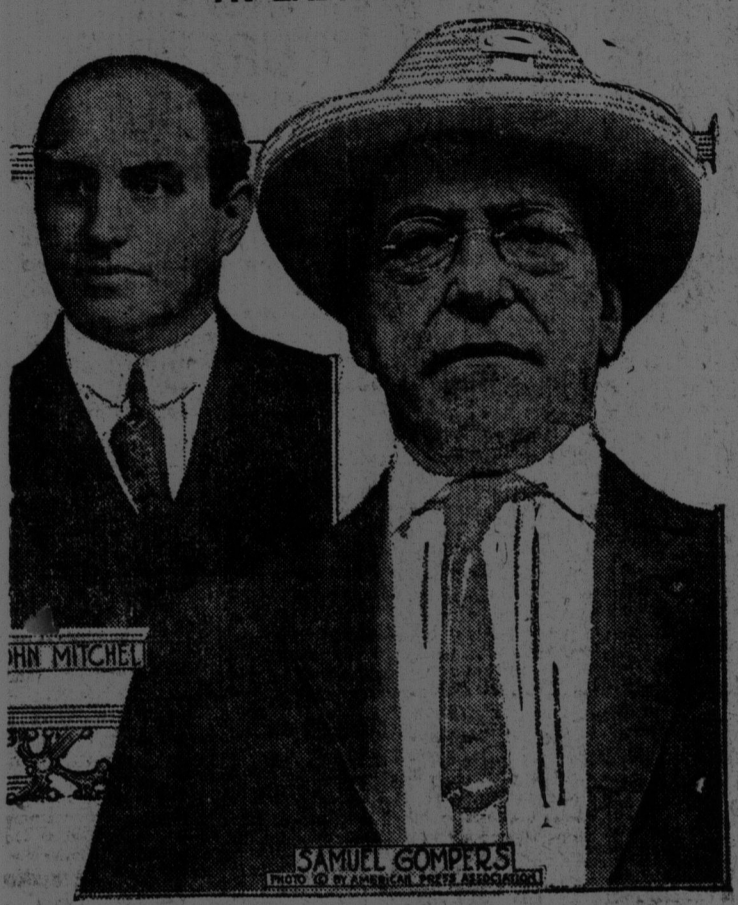

EDMONTON TO VOTE ON VARIOUS PLANS OF CITY GOVERNMENT

Edmonton, Alta., Nov. 4.—Numerous new elements, none of which, however, is political, will enter into the campaign of candidates for the mayoralty and five seats in the council at the election early in December.

Mayor William Short, K. C., author of the Edmonton charter, under which the city has the single tax and municipal ownership of the work of the city government, by an elective commission, declaring it would not meet the practical requirements of this municipality.

"We have \$14,000,000 invested in our public utilities," he said, "and the investment is a benefit for the people. Our chief trouble, now happily ended by the provincial legislature amending our charter, was that the council which engaged them could not discharge our commission without a two-third vote of the ten members. Moreover, we are now settling bills contracted by former administrations. The commission plan is a pretty theory—it may work out in American cities—but it does not fit our scheme of things."

"Our charter is adequate to requirements, but we must have men to carry out its provisions. If the electors of Edmonton will give me the right kind of council and commissioners, I'll save them millions of dollars every year. I cannot do it alone, nor can any other man. A good plan is good only with good men."

The Civic Government League, composed of prominent business men, is carrying on an active educational campaign, bringing speakers to Edmonton under the new plan. Mayor W. J. Hindley of Spokane, fired "the opening gun" at a gathering of 2,200 men and women the night of October 24, when he spoke for two hours amid the closest attention.

SAYS CURLERS ARE TOO NOISY

Ontario Woman Brings Action Against The Strabury Club

London, Ont., Nov. 4.—Contending that curlers are a noisy lot, and that the carrying of balls they give vent to warlike whoops that offend and rattle the nerves, Mrs. Jennie Taylor of Strabury has entered action here for \$500 damages against the officers of the curling club of that city.

Her residence adjoins the curling rink, and she asserts that the curlers are so boisterous during play that the rink is a positive nuisance and should be removed. The suit will be tried with several others at a special session of the county court to be held here on Wednesday.

McGowan and James McMurphy. A short programme of music was carried out to which C. Gilvan, Harry Shaw and F. I. Archibald contributed.

The brotherhood meets on Sunday afternoons for the study of social problems, and those who have not attended these meetings were invited to do so. Another matter discussed was the need of a new church organ to replace the present instrument. The new organ will be needed within the next two or three years, the cost is estimated at least \$5,000.
