

**CARBOLIC ACID.**—Carbolic acid is now so generally employed as a disinfecting agent that a resume of the various forms in which it is made, in the largest establishment carrying on its manufacture in England (Calvert's) may prove of interest. 1. Solid carbolic acid of three different qualities, the point of solidification of which varies from 81 to 108 Fah. 2. Liquid acid of two different qualities, constituted almost entirely of cresylic acid. According to Mr. Calvert, the disinfecting properties of the latter substance are the same as those of carbolic acid. 3. Soaps in which the proportion of carbolic acid varies from 5 to 20 per cent, according to the uses to which they are to be applied. The alkali is obtained from alum factories, where kaolin is treated with sulphuric acid. The disinfecting acids become thoroughly incorporated with it, forming a dry and pulverulent substance.
