

RANDOLPH SAVINGS BANK RAIDED IN BROAD DAYLIGHT BY FOUR ARMED MEN WHO SECURED \$40,000

Bound and Gagged Cashier and Clerk in Massachusetts Town, Went Through the Vaults, Got Cash and Securities, Leaped Into a Waiting Automobile and Made Their Escape.

Randolph, Mass., Nov. 17.—The Savings Bank was raided today by four armed men, who bound Treasurer N. Irving Tolman, a woman clerk and a collector, stripped the vault of bonds, cash and valuables estimated at \$40,000 to \$50,000 and fled in an automobile in which they had come. They left no clue except the automobile's registry number, which is assigned to a man at Greenfield. The men were of foreign extraction, Treasurer Tolman said.

Depositors are protected against the loss, according to the treasurer. Part of the booty was in Liberty Bonds, some of it was in cash and valuables placed in deposit by customers. It was within a few minutes of closing time this afternoon, Mr. Tolman said, when two young men entered the bank lobby. One asked for a pen, and both started to write at a desk. The treasurer noticed nothing peculiar about them at the time. Two other men entered the bank a few minutes just after the last remaining customers had gone.

With their appearance one of the men at the desk vaulted the railing and with revolver extended ordered Treasurer Tolman to throw up his hands. Another pinned Miss Frances Howard, a clerk, to the wall, stopping her mouth with his hands, and the other two were over the railing and at the vault in a moment. In the debate on the Grand Trunk bill which ended in Ottawa a few days ago, Hon. George W. Fowler, who opposed the measure as it stood, delivered the following address:

House, and I feel that it is a duty that I owe to the country, and that I would not be properly discharging that duty unless I voted against the measure.

Without further discussion, I will simply state the points upon which I oppose the legislation.

1. That the proposed price is out of all proportion to the physical value of the property to be acquired.

2. That the advantages of public ownership and management of railways has not yet been proven to such an extent as to justify such an addition to our present tax load.

3. That our present financial obligations are so heavy a burden on this country that it is unwise and dangerous to add to them so great a load as the purchase of the Grand Trunk Railway would impose.

4. That the present Parliament has no such mandate from the electorate as to authorize it to commit the country to so huge an expenditure without an appeal to the people.

5. That the present scheme is subversive of the all-Canadian transportation principle governing our railway building for the last thirty-five years.

6. That if it were really necessary to purchase the Grand Trunk Railway, we should have it examined as to actual and potential value by a commission of independent railway experts and pay for it only what it is actually and physically worth.

7. That a considerable portion of the Grand Trunk Railway's mileage and terminals is in the United States, and it is not desirable that Canada should spend huge sums either to acquire or maintain railways in and for the benefit of a foreign country.

8. That as a resident of and representative of a Maritime Province (if this deal goes through) I feel that our eastern winter ports will be unduly discriminated against in favor of Portland by reason of the shorter haul.

These are the reasons that actuate me in opposing this legislation. I feel great regret in doing so, but I feel my responsibilities as a member of this

Large Audience At St. David's Church

Mastery Sermon by J. A. Clark, D. D. Preached Last Evening

The new St. David's church was filled with an audience last evening, with deep interest to a mastery sermon preached by Rev. J. A. Clark, D. D. The preliminary exercises were conducted by Rev. J. A. Kelgan, the pastor of the church, the choir of German Street Church assisted in the music.

Dr. Clark's opening sermon clearly an introduction to a series of sermons which he will preach at the week.

Dr. Clark's subject last evening the story of regeneration, and he announced his text, he said that addresses during the week would be on the old message which he hoped would appeal to open the minds and hearts.

He chose for his text St. John 9: "And this is the condemnation, light has come into the world, but men loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil."

People know the advantages of such other things, but they will not do so, unless they are forced to do so.
