French Battlefields

Advance Guard of Canadian and American Visitors is Now in Paris.

Paris, June 27—Many Canadian and United States' Rotarians arrived in Paris today in advance of the main body of the delegates who are expected to reach here Friday and Saturday for their official visit to France.

An extensive programme is being arranged for the visitors. This will commence with services at the French Protestant church in Paris next Sunday morning. More than four hundred delegates are expected to come to Paris. British Rotary Clubs also have been invited.
