AT ST. ANDREW'S RINK.

The News of Victory Far and Near Was Joyously Heard.

The Liberals heard the details of victory at St. Andrew's rink; the Conservatives mourned at the Victoria rink. Shortly after the polls closed the people began to crush into St. Andrew's rink, where a platform had been built.

I can assure you that my heart is almost too full for utterance. The result today, I feel, more than compensates for all the drawbacks of public life. I cannot help thinking that this victory which has been won today—not my victory, but yours—(cheers) will round from one end of the dominion (cheers) as the greatest which will be achieved in this memorable campaign.

Of the 14 wards including two non-resident wards, eight went straight Liberal—Kings, Prince, Queens, Dukes, Sydney, and Lorne. The two Carleton wards, Gays and Brocks, and Lorne ward of the North End, three other wards supported Mr. Blair.

The Minister Escorted by a Tremendous Crowd from St. Andrew's Rink to His Hotel—His Carriage Drawn by the Enthusiastic People.

Such a demonstration was never before accorded a political candidate in St. John. There was nothing prepared about it, it was the spontaneous outburst of a people whose feelings of admiration for the man of jubilation at his victory moved them to a wonderful exhibition of pleasure.

When other political workers had been heard from, all giving Liberal majority, Mr. D. James remarked: "We are beaten 70 or 80."

At 6:05 o'clock, when a return was posted showing that Mr. Foster led in Lorne No. 1 by 20 votes, the first cheers broke out. This was followed by the cheering of the supporters of Mr. Gannon's prospects in Charlotte.

At 6:10 Mr. Foster and Mr. Stockton appeared there and were cheerfully greeted by the increasing crowd. While the candidates scanned the blackboard, which already had been covered by the returns from these wards, the cheering was so loud and so outward sign of disappointment, but his colleague's countenance portended his defeat.

Mr. Alexander Gibson, Jr. has won his election. He was elected by a majority of 118 votes over his opponent, Mr. McLeod.
