**"LORD" COVENEY AGAIN.**

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Jan. 11.—Some time ago a person named Charles Duffell, who represented himself as a near relative of the Earl of Shaftesbury, and a member of the Queen's Guards, arrived here. He has been having a splendid time in the city, gaining admission to the best circles. On his representation that his reminiscences were delayed, he has borrowed a good deal of money in sums from \$5 to \$1000. He failed so many times to pay at the time promised that inquiries were made as to his financial condition. The climax was reached today when the pretenses of the Earl of Shaftesbury were discovered. The man was identified as the same person who has been victimizing different persons in New York, Baltimore, New York, Montreal and elsewhere. He is known as Hugh L. Courtney, alias Lord Courtney, alias Lord Vere, alias Lord Duffell, as described in the police records. His indebtedness in this city is large. He represented yesterday that he had received a despatch from the British Minister at Washington asking him to come to see him, and he had raised \$500 on this invitation and left for that effect.

**THE POSITION OF FRANCE.**

The country desired peace, but should never consent to a war which it would not win. It had not lost time during the past fifteen years.
