| Uplands, Ontario | November 7th 1943 | | Overcast at 250 to 300 feet. No flying. Mass for Roman Catholics was held in the Recreation Hall at 1000 hours, Flight Lieutenant Mooney officiating. Church Parade for Protestants at 1100 hours with an R.A.F. Chaplain in charge, due to absence in hospital of the Station Chaplain, Flight Lieutenant Perkins. A special showing of the picture "Life Begins at 8:30" was well received by a large audience. | |
| | November 8th 1943 | | Heavy rain showers; no flying. "The Masquers", a review sponsored by T. Eaton Company, Montreal, presented a very talented programme to a capacity audience in the Recreation Hall. Musical numbers, dance routines, vocal and specialty acts all contributed to an enjoyable evening. The troupe were entertained at dinner preceding the show and later at the Officers' Mess. | |
| | November 9th 1943 | | Overcast with rain showers. "Life Begins at 8:30", with Monty Woolley, was the feature shown in the Recreation Hall to a large audience. | |
| | November 10th 1943 | | Cloudy to overcast, snow showers. Class No. 87 proceeded to Carp today, inaugurating the new system of Advanced Flight training. The aircraft and instructional personnel are to proceed from Uplands to Carp on Thursday morning, November 11th. The second anniversary of arrival of W.D. personnel at Uplands was celebrated in fitting style by a dance at the Recreation Hall attended by the Commanding Officer, Senior Officers of the Station and a capacity crowd. A number of originals were visitors for the occasion. | |
| | November 11th 1943 | | Partly cloudy to cloudy: The aircraft and remainder of personnel for Carp moved as scheduled. Flight Lieutenant D.H. Armstrong is the first O.C. of the new Unit. A Remembrance Day observance ceremony was carried out at 1100 hours. All aircraft in the vicinity landed during the observance and personnel "fell in" outside their respective sections. Two minutes silence was observed with the sounding of "Last Post" and "Reveille" by Station Trumpeters. | |
