Manitoba act is about the same, but certain words of this subsection are left out.

Latest decision of Privy Council holds that this appeal to the Govt in Council must be for some purpose, - that act if not undone would be legal, this is ^{left interpretation of this clause} _(Sub section 4) - yet is given power to legislate & correct the pre-judicial effect of the province refuses to correct it itself, but only to the extent of what has been done.

No initiative is taken by Govt in Council, yet cannot take the initiative. If province refuses the Govt in Council refers the matter to Parliament.

Sec. 95 in reference to immigration. It is the only section in the act which deals with concurrent legislation. Each province may legislate re. immigration except where its legis. holds till the dominion legislates on this point - conflicts with provinces.
