The Lake Athabaska Gold Field, situated 490 miles N.E. of Edmonton and easily accessible by train and boat, came into being in the Fall of 1934. Among the pioneers was North West Minerals Ltd., - a Western Canadian Company that acquired extensive, carefully selected holdings on the recommendation of W. B. "Gold has been found during trenching operations at three places. In the first, the red and grey granite contains numerous parallel and cross quartz stringers....Visible gold occurs both as fine flakes and as more massive kernels both in the quartz and in the adjacent granite. One trench shows visible gold over a width of fourteen feet. The second discovery was made in a quartz vein twelve inches wide. The granite here also contains a number of parallel and cross quartz stringers. The third discovery lies about 1000 feet from the first. It is a well defined quartz vein in red granite and varies in width from twelve to thirty inches."

Assay results appearing in the company's 1935 report show values running from \$2.10 to \$468.00 per ton. Bulk sampling of 100 lbs. of the granite porphyry returned values of \$5.88 to \$268.00 per ton.

The excellent results thus obtained have warranted the extensive drilling and underground development program of 1936 now under way.
