Ottawa 2nd March, 1902.

Sir,

I am directed to order from you five thoroughbred shorthorn bulls, six work oxen and six heifers, to be delivered not later than the 15th of May next to the Indian Agents mentioned for the sum of \$125.00 (one hundred and twenty five dollars) each for the bulls, \$65.00 (sixty five dollars) each for the oxen and \$27.00 (twenty seven dollars) each of the heifers.

The bulls must be first class, pedigreed, registered animals, and pass inspection as sound and of good quality. They must be either Manitoba or North West bred, and subject to inspection and acceptance of the Indian Agent.

The oxen should be not over six nor under four years of age, free from bodily defects, in good condition and thoroughly broken. The heifers should be first class, two year old grades in calf, and must be acceptable to the Indian Agent, as well as the oxen.

Kindly notify the Indian Agents when when to expect their arrival so that they can arrange to take them over.

All expenses of delivery, including transport, are to be borne by you.

The pedigrees of the bulls should be handed to the Indian Agents, together with your account.
