

- ary of No 1 reserve to opposite No 2 Reserve. The land to be $\frac{1}{4}$ mile wide from the river up to the hills. All or part of this for pasture &c.

(7) " Ample irrigation water for all the present reserves & lands to be made reserves from four creeks viz 26, 27, 28, & 35 mile creeks. This water to be recorded for the Indians. If we can get all these places the band will be satisfied & consider they have got a sufficiency of farm & pasture land for their needs, at least as far as possible considering the nature of the country & scarcity of land." This band presented a short statement as to compensations expected & help for working reserves if a settlement is reached. (see below)

- Fishing This band has the exclusive rights of fishing on both banks of Lillooet river. The entire length of No 1 & 2 reserves (see Royal Com. report page 694)

Fishing is very important to these people who owing to the very inferior & limited nature of their reserves depend largely on salmon for food.

- Fishing, Hunting & Trapping & other matters requiring adjustment & settlement, these people declare they are of one mind with the interior Indians generally.
