Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter together with an enclosure, in the form of a letter from the Provincial Game Warden, in which he complains that Indian Agents never acknowledge the copies of the game regulations sent us.

In regard to these I beg to state that I have received these notices, but as they are not accompanied with any letter, we do not know from where they came or who sent them, so we do not know to whom acknowledgement has to be sent.

As for his statement that Agents neglect to inform the Indians of their contents he is quite wrong, as I always send what copies I have of the Game and other acts to the different chiefs and advise them to inform the Indians as to their contents.

I always talk the matter over with the Indians at their meetings so that they will understand them.
