

ECLIPSES FOR THE YEAR 1818.

THERE will be Four Eclipses, in the following order :--

The First will be a visible Eclipse of the MOON, April 20th, in the evening--

Beginning..... 7h. 4m.
Middle 8h. 13m.
End 9h. 22m.

Digits eclipsed, 5 on the D's south limb.

The Second will be of the SUN, May 5th, in the morning, partly visible--

Beginning..... 3h. 41m.
Middle 4h. 52m.
End..... 5h. 59m.

Digits eclipsed, 6.

The Third, a visible Eclipse of the MOON, October 14th, in the morning--

Beginning..... 12h. 7m.
Middle..... 1h. 31m.
End..... 2h. 55m.

Digits eclipsed 5½ on the D's north limb.

The last, of the SUN, October 29th, 1h. 16m. afternoon ; invisible.

VENUS will be the Morning Star until March 12th ;
Evening Star from that time 'till the 26th December.
