agent, or any other person, on his, her, or their behalf, act as the servant or agent of any other individual, in the purchase of any meat, or other article of provision, offered for sale in this City

before the hour aforesaid.

XXVIII. That hucksters, dealers, and all persons frequenting the public Markets, with poultry, vegetables, fruits, or farm or garden produce, shall have places assigned to them by the Market Superintendent, under the general directions of the Chairman of the Market Committee; and all hucksters, dealers, and other persons frequenting the Markets with poultry, vegetables, or farm or garden produce, refusing to remain in the places assigned to them shall be liable to the penalties hereinafter provided. Hucksters occupying stalls within the said Market are hereby prohibited from the sale of fish, flesh or fowl.

XXIX. The Market Committee, or any mem-

ber thereof, or the Health Inspector, may inspect all meats, or other articles of provisions, that may be exposed for sale in the public Markets, and, in his or their own discretion, may seize and destroy, or cause to be destroyed, such as may be blown, tainted or otherwise unfit to be

used as food.

XXX. The said Committee shall have the control over all the officers of the City employed in or about the public Markets, and shall have the power to make any regulations as to the Markets, or the lessees or occupants of the same, as to the officers of the City employed there, and as to all persons attending or frequenting the same.

XXXI. That the lessees of the market fees shall bave full power to collect all rates, rents and fees belonging to them, excepting the r nts of stalls, in the market buildings, and to dispose or remove any person refusing to pay the same, under the authority of the Mayor, Police Magistrate, or any Justice of the Peace for the

City of Winnipeg

XXXII. The butchers' stalls in the Central Market and any other market that may be hereafter established, and the hucksters' stalls in the same, shall be let annually in the wonth of January after the year 1877, by public auction—the said butchers' stalls at an upset price of five hundred dollars, and the hucksters' stalls at an upset price of two hundred and fifty dollars yearly rental, under regulations of the Market Committee; and for the present year the said stalls shall be let on the sixteenth day of April in same manner, possession to be given on the first day of May next, and written leases of the same shall be immediately thereafter executed, in which leases it shall be stipulated amongst other things, that the term of the said lease shall commence on the first day of February then next ensuing; that the rent shall be paid monthly to the Chamberlain on the first day of each month, in advance; that the lessees shall in no instance, directly or indirecly, sub-let the said stalls or any thereof, or otherwise dispose of any interest they may have in the same; that they shall not permit the said stalls or any part thereof to be occupied by any person or persons whomso-ever other than themselves, without the special consent of the Market Committee, obtained in writing; that they shall observe and comply

with all the rules, regulations, and by-laws now legally established, or that may be hereafter established, for the government of the public markets in this city; and that their neglect, omission, disregard or violation of any of the said stipulations shall have the effect of immediately annulling the said leases, and forfeiting their possession of the stalls.

XXXII 2. That on the sixteenth day of April in this year, and in every succeeeding year on the same day as the letting of the Market stalls, the lease of the tolls of the Public Markets in the City of Winnipeg, under this By-Law, for the year, or part of year, following, shall be put up by auction, and adjudged to the highest bid-der under regulations of the Market Committee. XXXIII. That all hay, straw, and fire-wood,

brought into the City, in a waggon, cart, sleigh, or other vehicle, to be sold, or offered for sale, shall be exposed for sale in the hay, straw, and wood market, as established by this By-Law, or which may be bereafter established in this City, and at no other place within the said City, and all such waggons, carts, sleighs, or other vehicles, shall be placed in said hay, straw and wood markets, in such order and position as the Market Superintendent shall determine, and no person shall depart from the line or order in which he has been placed, before he has disposed of his load unless to leave the Market, nor shall he loiter about the streets of the City with his load. There shall be paid to the lessee of the said Market, by the owner or driver of every waggon, cart, sleigh, or other vehicle, bringing into this City for sale hay, straw, or wood the fee or fees hereinafter provided in the schedule

XXXIV. In the event of hay, straw, or wood, being brought into the City, on any ship, vessel boat, raft, or craft of any description, to be sold thereout or therefrom, it shall be the duty of the owner or captain to report the same forthwith to the lessee of the hay, straw, and wood market, who shall be entitled to demand, and receive, and take, for every such ship, vessel, boat, raft, or craft, the fees as set forth in the schedule of fees hereunto annexed. Every person bringing hay, straw, grain fodder, feed, or wood, to the City for sale, by whatever mode of conveyance, shall be obliged to give to the proper officer, when required to do so, a true statement, to the best of his knowledge, of the

weight or quantity thereof.

XXXV. That every person buying or selling hay, straw or wood in the said City, may require the same to be weighed on any of the public scales of the City, or measured, as the case

XXXVI. That any person refusing to pay the market fees, or giving a wilfully false return of the quantity or weight of hay, straw, or wood, or refusing to have the said hay or straw weighed, or the said wood measured, when demanded by the purchaser thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an infraction of this By-Law.

XXXVII. That any person committing or attempting to commit any fraud, in the selling or weighing of hay, straw, or any other article or thing, by introducing heavy articles into the waggon, or other vehicle, or by wetting or con-cealing wet or unmerchantable articles in the load, or by using any fraudulent device or contrivance, or by an liable to the penalt XXXVIII.
