HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitobe or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 25, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to provide weed lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-cuarter section of 160 acres, more or less. BNTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land effice for the District in which the land to be taken in

ottuata, or if the homesteader do sires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the Deletrict in which the land is estimate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee entry. entry. of \$10 is charged for a homest

SOMBSTRAD DUTIES.

A cettler who has been granted as entry for a homestand to required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the canditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:

(i) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

year during the term of three years.

(3) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is eligible to make a hemostead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be catified by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settier has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a contificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-

tificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner prescribed by this Act, and has peatented by this Act, and has estained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be estimated by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first home stead.

(d) If the cettler has his per-runnent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be attisfied by residence upon the anial land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same tewnship or an adjoining or connecting township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his bomestead, or substitute 30 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 60 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his centry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT.

Should be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homesteed In-Spector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six Commissioner of Domision Lands months notice in writing to the at Ottawa of his intention to do so. INFORMATION.
