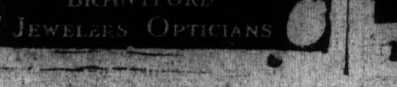

W.C.T.U. Presses Claims Against Clergymen.

NEW YORK, Oct. 27.—The resolution of the World's Christian Temperance Union, a resolution Saturday request house of bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church to "consolidate property" of using sacramental wine of fermented wine, "which is the narcotic poison alcohol."

The resolution was a substitute one originally offered setting that fermented wine "could not represent the blood of Christ."

This phrase was objected English delegates, who declare it would antagonize the Church of England. The English delegate objected to an amendment that "Jesus commanded unfere wine to the holy communion."

BERLIN, Oct. 27.—Fritz Celor Ludwig Max Goldberger, the known capitalist and economist at his residence in Berlin this evening, aged 65 years. The immediate cause of death was arteriosclerosis, combined with heart disease.
