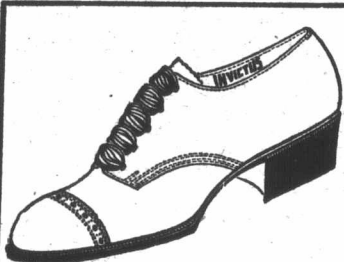

Will the Canadian Northern be Purchased?

According to advice from Ottawa some important developments are expected by Parliamentarians as to the plan of the C. P. R. in regard to the "segregation of extraneous assets." For several years the Canadian Pacific has been accumulating a cash reserve fund of large proportions, and it has been rumored in well-informed Parliamentary circles here for some time that the company had its eye on the Canadian Northern Railway, and was simply awaiting an occasion to take it over. This rumor has again been revived.—Toronto Sun.

VILLAGE OF HAVELOCK, ONT.
BY-LAW NO. 269.

To take the vote of the rate-payers of the Village of Havelock entitled to vote on money by-laws, on a question to be submitted whether the said rate-payers are in favor of a supply of electric power from the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

WHEREAS the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Havelock deems it advisable to submit to the ratepayers of the said Village of Havelock entitled to vote on money by-laws a question as to whether the said ratepayers are in favor of a supply of electric power from the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario.

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Havelock enacts as follows:

1.—THAT the following question be submitted to the ratepayers of the Village of Havelock entitled to vote on money by-laws:

Are you in favor of obtaining from the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario a supply of electric power?

2.—THAT the votes of the said rate-payers shall be taken on this question at the following time and places by the Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

The time shall be at the regular Municipal Election to be held on the 5th day of January, 1914.

Also the voting for sub-division No. 1 and for sub-division No. 2 shall be held in the same places as the Municipal Election on the 5th day of January, 1914.

And also the Deputy Returning Officers and Poll Clerks shall be the same appointees as are appointed for the Municipal Election on the 5th day of January, 1914.

3.—A true copy of this by-law shall be published in the Havelock Standard issued on the 18th and 25th days of December, 1913, and on the 1st day of January, 1914, and a copy of this by-law shall be posted in the Post Office, the Town Hall, the Clerk's Office and at the corner of George and Orange streets.

4.—On the 15th day of December, at his office, in the Council Chamber, in the Town Hall, in the Village of Havelock, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, the Reeve will, in writing signed by him, appoint two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk of this Corporation, and also one person to attend each polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the answering of the said question in the affirmative, and like number on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of the answering of the said question in the negative respectively.

5.—The 6th day of January, 1914, at the said Council Chamber, in the Town Hall, at 2 o'clock, is hereby appointed for the summing-up by the Clerk of this Corporation of the number of votes given in the affirmative and in the negative respectively.

MADE, PASSED and ENACTED this fifteenth day of December, 1913.
