The criminal causes were disposed of as follows:

King vs. Fraser for assault found guilty with recommendation for leniency—sentenced to six hours in County Jail.

King vs. Barkhouse, passed, as defendant is overseas.

King vs. Bowlby, no bill.

King vs. Kelly, guilty for bigamy with recommendation to mercy. Kelley was sentenced to two years at Dorchester.

The case of the Bank of Nova Scotia against N. W. & F. N. Ilsley occupied the time of the Court all day Wednesday. It was an action on a bond and the defence was that the bond was executed under an agreement to stifle a prosecution for forgery. The Judge charged very strongly in favor of the defendants, and submitted three questions to the Jury namely.

1 Was the bond sued on executed under or on account of an arrangement by the Plaintiff through its Agent in that behalf that a prosecution against one Le Roy Ilsley for forgery would be abandoned or should not go on?

2 Did the defendants understand from what took place between themselves and the Bank's Agent that if they executed the bond sued on, the prosecution against one Le Roy Ilsley would not be carried on and.

3 Was the object of executing the bond in question to obtain an abandonment of the prosecution against one Le Roy Ilsley and was it understood by the Plaintiff Bank.

The Jury found all of these questions in favor of the defendants and judgment was given by the Court accordingly for the defendants.

The case was conducted on the part of the Plaintiff by the Mr. H. H. Wickwire, K.C. and Mr. J. Frank Outhit, and on the part of the defendants by Mr. Roscoe, K. C.
