## RURAL MAIL DELIVERY

The Postoffice Department has by no means slackened its efforts to lay out rural mail delivery routes.

While it is expected that there will not be the same rush by farmers to get free delivery in the winter as in the summer, the Postoffice Department is ready to receive applications from any group of farmers along any established mail route, and when received an inspector will be sent over the route to report as to the outlook. If his report be favorable, the free delivery will be started as soon as climatic conditions permit.
