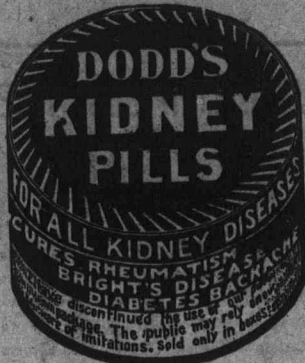

Blenheim, Dec. 28.—In the police court case here this morning before P. M. Greenwood, Egh. Adair, Jr., was charged by James Marshall with assault. The quarrel took place in the Erie House parlour on Christmas Day, and ended in Adair's striking Marshall and giving him a black eye.
