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THE ENEMY'S VITALS

General March, Chief of Staff of the United States Army, says the American troops brigaded with the British and French forces are being withdrawn as rapidly as possible to join the First American Army under General Pershing.

The front on which the First American Army is stationed is generally known. It lies between Verdun and the Swiss border and always has been held by powerful forces on both sides, for it is as vital to one as to the other. It protects the rear of each and the army which smashed through it would have the heart of its foe exposed to it. Incidentally, it is on this front that the Germans invaded France in 1870. When the present war broke out France expected another German invasion by that route and Joffre struck swiftly in Lorraine to anticipate it.

On this front and in the valleys of the Meuse and Moselle, behind it, General Pershing must have nearly a million troops for it is there that American soldiers are moved after they have had their front-line training in brigades with British and French soldiers. The intention clearly is that when Foch shall give the word the United States will strike at Germany a blow worthy of its power and vast resources, and there is little doubt that this blow will be delivered against the Rhine. That time may not be this year, but it certainly will not be later than next

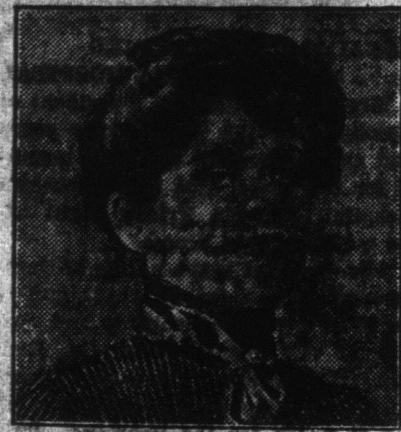

into contact with the ways of civilization. Azah suffers, rejoices and in the end finds happiness and heart's desire.

Since the first of January of this year 14,500 claims have been presented to the Workmen's Compensation Board, and of these 110 have been deaths. Last year industrial accidents up to December 31 numbered 217. More claims are being presented to the board to a much larger extent than in the first year, when the act was not so well understood by workmen and employers as it is to-day.

Rev. William Duncan, one of the real pioneer missionaries of the west, whose name will go down upon the pages of Canadian history, is dead at the age of 86 at Annette Island, Alaska. He was the first Protestant missionary to go into the wilds of British Columbia. He came to the Pacific Coast when British Columbia was a Crown colony and established his first mission at Metlakatla sixty-one years ago.
