A GENERAL ELECTION

A Vancouver dispatch says the governing body of the National Liberal Party of Canada has been summoned by the Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King to meet in Ottawa next week in anticipation of a general election to be held before next Spring.

There is very little likelihood of a general election in Canada before next Spring. No Government in its senses would go to the country on the heels of a budget such as that which was introduced by Sir Harry Drayton and which is raising a big howl from producer, manufacturer, retailer and consumer, all of whom it hits in varying degrees. Besides, the movement of the members of the House for an increase in the sessional indemnity would not be pressed as vigorously as the present agitation is being pressed if a general election were in early prospect. The members would be disposed to let the next Parliament grapple with that subject.

A general election in the Fall of 1921 is a reasonable projection. The life of the present Parliament will not expire until near the end of 1922 but we doubt if the Government could withstand the disintegrating influences operating against it until that time. The desertions to the independent seats which began when the Budget of 1919 was introduced are steadily continuing and by the end of next session there be a sufficient membership on the "cross benches" to make the position of the Administration too precarious to risk to chance beyond 1921.

NAVY LEAGUE PUBLICITY

The Navy League of Canada, in the furtherance of its policy to promote popular appreciation of Naval history, traditions, functions and duties, in this Dominion, is issuing a series of leaflets of a highly informing and educational nature. Copies are being received by members of the League and will be helpful to those in enlarging their views of the principles and policy of the League and stimulating their activity in the cause of Empire defence by adequate sea power.

It might be well to observe here that it is not sufficient for these leaflets to be circulated among members of the Navy League, but that the propaganda should be carried farther afield and every means be taken to bring these educational pamphlets before the people in general. The libraries should be supplied with bound copies, the schools, the members of patriotic and community associations, and school trustees and even members of municipal councils. Those admirable associations for deepening the intellectual and patriotic life of the rural districts—the Women's Institutes—should be well and regularly supplied. In other quarters the distribution of these well-written and concise statements of the principles, and policy of the Navy League of Canada and of the speeches of men of prominence in

COWICHAN GAP

The Editor, the Nanaimo Herald.
Dear Sir:—I would like to call the attention of the authorities through the medium of your paper, to the dangerous state of affairs which prevails at Cowichan Gap. A very narrow escape from a serious drowning accident took place there the other day, and similar events happen with great frequency, for the Jap fishermen who ply their calling in the middle of the channel, take no notice whatever of passing steamers. On the day in question a Jap and his wife were fishing there in a large launch when the Tug Earl with a transfer barge in tow, came through the Gap on her way from Ladysmith to Vancouver. The Jap was drifting with the tide, and though the Captain of the Earl blew his whistle repeatedly, the Jap remained where he was, forcing the tug boat to stop. And only just in time, for even as it was the Jap's boat was caught under the bow of the laden scow, and had it not been for the lucky chance which allowed the launch to be caught right across the bow of the tug, there would inevitably have been a drowning accident. Fortunately I had seen the predicament in which they were placed, and was able to shout to Mr. James Jackson, of Nanaimo, who was fishing near by, and who went to the assistance of the Japs, who by this time were so scared that they were almost helpless. Had it not been for the fact that the captain of the Earl stopped his engines the Jap boat would undoubtedly have been sent to the bottom. As it was the Earl lost a lot of time and was caused much inconvenience by the fact that her wire hawser sank to the bottom as soon as the strain was taken of it, and got fouled there, causing the tug's crew no end of trouble to get it clear again. The authorities should prohibit the Japs from fishing right in the channel, or at least give them warning of the danger which they run by doing so, for it is almost a daily occurrence for a tug passing through the Gap, to have to slow down and signal for the Japs to get out of the way.

ROME TO TOKIO FLIGHT COMPLETED

Two Italian Army Aviators Have Successfully Negotiated a Twelve Thousand Mile Flight.

Tokio, June 1.—(Can. Press).—Mastering a tempest that raged in the Hankone mountains, forty miles southeast of the Metropolis, the Italian aviators Lieut. Masiero and Ferrari, arrived in Tokio today, completing a flight of twelve thousand miles from Rome.

The aviators left Osaka at ten o'clock this morning and were separated in the mountains, where they were buffeted by a hurricane of rain, wind and thunder. The members of the Cabinet, delegations from the army and navy and the Italian embassy, and one hundred thousand spectators had gathered at the landing field. Ferrari was lost in the storm and compelled to land. He resumed the trip soon after, however, and arrived undamaged. He also was tendered a tremendous ovation and showered with flowers and gifts.

Masiero's elapsed flying time from Rome to Tokio was 93 hours 51 minutes, while Ferrari's time was 94 hours, 55 minutes.

FLOOD DOES GREAT DAMAGE IN ENGLAND

Twenty Dead Bodies Have Been Recovered in Louth, and Many More Are Still Unaccounted For.

Louth, Eng., June 1.—Twenty bodies of those who lost their lives on Saturday night through the sudden overflow of the River Lud, have been recovered, and many persons are still missing.

Unofficial estimates place the death toll at about 50. At least 50 houses were washed away and hundreds of others were damaged. Upwards of 1000 persons are homeless. The damage is estimated at 250,000 pounds. The waters of the river have now subsided.

Premier Lloyd George has sent a message to the Mayor of Louth, asking what assistance the Government could render.

The fury of the storm which caused the overflow of the Lud, centered about Louth, but also swept across the country, its track being from North Wales to Shropshire, Lancashire, Lincolnshire and subsequently Cambridgeshire, where it expended its fury. Floods were experienced in many districts, numerous cattle were drowned, and much material damage is reported.

Paris, June 1.—(Canadian Press).—Announcement by the Government that medals would be awarded to mothers of large families, have resulted in a large number of applications.

Only those who have reared their children in the best moral and physical surroundings, with a proper understanding of their duty to France, are eligible.

To a mother having five children, the youngest of whom is not less than five years old, a bronze medal will be given. The mother of eight will receive a silver medal, and one who has ten children will be awarded a gold medal.

DANES WILL FOUND COLONY IN CANADA

Montreal, June 1.—A large party of Danes have arrived at Quebec and will proceed to the Western Provinces with the view of purchasing large tracts of land and establishing a Danish colony. These men represent the prosperous agricultural class of Denmark.

A party of about 200 steerage passengers from Scandinavia, went west last night en route for the Prairie Provinces and British Columbia, where they are planning to first work in agricultural and fruit growing districts so as to gain experience and later on to invest their capital. A number of mechanical and civil engineers are among the cabin passengers who are en route to Ontario and British Columbia.

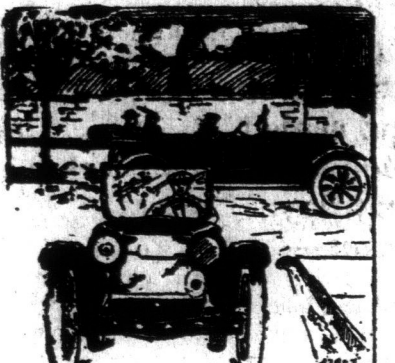
