SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-empt ten six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra).

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

And Discuss Necessary Precautions For The New Campbellton.

FIRE PROOF BUILDINGS

Peter Clinch, Esq., Secretary of the N. B. Fire Underwriters met the Town Council and Executive Committee here Saturday morning and went fully into the matter of fire districts for Campbellton.

He stated that the N. B. Underwriters would not sanction the erection of anything but brick, stone or cement or other fireproof material in District Number One, which embraces Water Street from Victoria Street to the Water at Ramsay Street, one hundred feet on each side of said street.

In District Number Two all buildings of thirty-five feet or less must have fireproof roofs, over that height must be constructed as in District Number One.

The balance of the town may have shingle roofs.

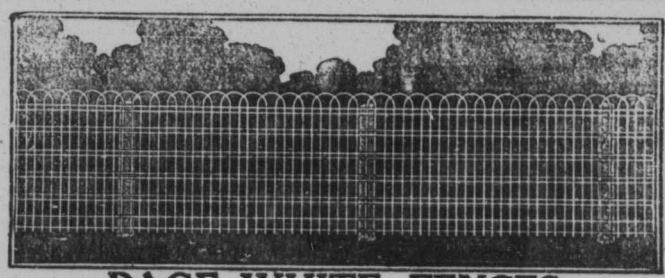
