AIR PRIZE OF \$50,000 GIVEN BY AUSTRALIA

Commonwealth Offer Inducements for a Flight From Britain to Australia.

London, March 24.—A cable from Melbourne says: "The Commonwealth Government is offering a prize of \$50,000 for the first successful flight from Great Britain to Australia that is undertaken by Australians."

Another entry for the £10,000 prize offered by the Daily Mail for the first flight across the Atlantic was made in behalf of Major J. C. P. Wood, pilot, and Captain C. C. Wylie navigator.

They propose to make the attempt in an airplane of 375 horse power capable of a speed of 95 miles an hour when carrying a weight of 2,032 lbs.

DEMANDS OF RAILWAYMEN ARE CONCEDED

J. H. Thomas Says That Negotiations With the Government Were a Success.

(Special to The Journal) London, March 24.—In discussing today the negotiations between the railwaymen and the Government, J. H. Thomas, General Secretary of the National Union of Railwaymen said that most of the demands of the railwaymen had been conceded in principle and from that point the new negotiations had been a success. The great difference he added was not between the government and railwaymen but between the unions concerned.

WHAT TELEPHONE PLAN MEANS TO EMPLOYEES

The influenza epidemic of October and November last served to emphasize, in very striking fashion, the benefit to employees of big concerns of an enlightened scheme of sick benefits and pensions.

The Committee in charge of the Pension and Sick Benefit Plan, inaugurated in 1917 by the Bell Telephone Company has just issued its report for 1918. "The influenza epidemic," says the report, "greatly increased the number of sickness cases, particularly between October 1st and November 30th. The total number of cases during these two months was 1023, seventy-nine per cent of which was influenza, while during the first nine months of the year the total number of cases was only 917."

The following figures from the report show the extent to which the fund is serving Bell employees: Pensions \$5,925.82 Accident Disability Benefits \$428.56 Disability Expenses (accident only) \$389.33 Sickness Disability Benefits \$102,562.67 Death Benefits (including expenses) 29,398.79

Gross payments from Fund \$157,265.26 The report concludes: "Your Committee has recommended to the Company the inauguration of medical examination of all employees entering the service of the company after a certain date. This should appeal to all, as it is not only a benefit to the staff and to the Company, but to the applicant, as in some cases, it will doubtless be the means of drawing attention to ailments which if treated in time, can be cured, and will also insure that no one is given work for which they are physically unfit."

BRIDGEBURG NEWS

Workman Hit by a Crane but May Recover—Delegation to Toronto.

Bridgeburg, Ont., March 24.—Walter Kent, an employee of the Canadian Allis-Chalmers company, was severely injured yesterday when he was struck by an electric crane. His back and hips are badly injured, but it is said he has a fighting chance for recovery.

The Bridgeburg council is still up in the air on the pumping question. Engineer Louis Chapman did not have his report ready at the special meeting of the council on Friday night, but spent Saturday here and is making a complete diagnosis of conditions at the municipal pumping station. The majority of the council favors an intake well.

The Welland County Council may abandon the water bound macadam road, which has been built through out the county during the last four years. The concrete roadway is believed to be more satisfactory.
