CONTROVERTS TORY FALSE.

Editor Evening Telegram Dear Sir,-Permit me space to re-

ply to the statement made in this morning's editorial of the Daily News regarding a Bond-Coaker coalition. The article in question states that I ounced last evening the collapse of the F. P. U. movement and its absorption by the Bond Party. Editor Robinson knows full well that the statement is false, for I said no such hing. The talk of the collapse of the F. P. U. by the organ of the Morris Government is a case of a Morris wish being father to a Tory thought. It is further manifestly absurd in face of the fact which every citizen of St. John's is aware that on Tuesday last the F. P. U. had the biggest parade and the largest meeting of represe of the Island ever held in St. John's. So much for the falsehood of the Tory declaration that the F. P. U. has collapsed. Now as to the other matter. The F. P. U. has not been absorbed by the Liberal Party, nor will it be absorbed by the Liberal Party. It will remain an independent organization. Does Editor Robinson contend that the Irish Party and the Labor Party have been absorbed by the Liberal Party at home because they have decided to support, and are supporting to-day, the Asquith Government, in order to obtain the legislation they have set their minds upon? The F. P. U. is in a similar position. They desire to put an end to wild extravagance, land grabbing, soft jobs to incompetent heelers, and want a Government which will make the lot of the toilers easier and to do this they have set forth a programme of reforms, and the F. P. I must look to one party or the other and therefore to the party from which it can obtain what it wants. What I stated yesterday I repeat

to-day. The Government's conduct towards the F. P. U. during the last three years and their management of public affairs, especially regarding land grabbing and general extravagance is sufficient to invite the F. P. I'. to consider the advisability of in viting Sir R. Bond to become their political leader and thereby place themselves in the position to such attacks as those encountered in to-day's News and Chronicle, I can assure Sir E. P. Morris that the F. P. I' don't intend to be insulted with impunity by his organs, or to permit his organs to insult outport sealers again as has been done by the two Tory


