Earle, Esq., M.H.A., occupied the chair with his usual ability, and gave quite a new and original setting of the "Ode to Newfoundland," and charmed all as he sang to his own accompaniment. The exhibition closed at 10.30 p.m. with the hearty singing of the National Anthem by the large audience.

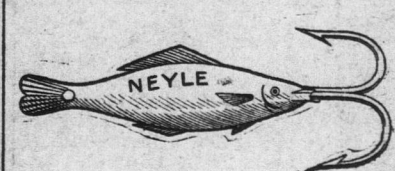
