Boelke's Foe, Dead, Continued Flying

scribe Thrilling Battles in the Air. natic incidents and interesting features are the reports just published of Captain Boelke, the famous German viator, who brought down forty hosile airplanes during his service with he army, which ended with his death on Oct. 29. As summarized by the Overseas News Agency, these reports from the field include the follow-

Shortly after the opening of the war, on Oct. 27, 1914, Boelke reported that on a reconnoitring trip over heims he had observed nine batteres, one of which was in close proxnity to the Cathedral. On July 6, 915, Boelke reported:

"The superiority of the German nachines is becoming more apparent. To-day I had the impression that the nemy was no longer offering resistance, but that he had nearly given up hope of escape. Shortly before the downfall of the hostile machine the bserver made a typical movement with his hands as to say, 'Why let us go on? We are done for, and surren-

"He fled," says Boelke's report, but it din't help him, for I was much uicker. I fired 500 shots, keeping up the fire until he began to fall. I had approached up to a distance of three meters, and still he hadn't beurned my machine rapidly on its left side. The enemy turned his unside down on the right hand. I did not see im any more.'

Many times hostile machines made eemingly incredible efforts to escape the much-feared German aviator, the nostile airman apparently desiring at least to save his own life, the reports indicate. On March 4th, 1916, Boelke






