HARRY THAW NOT A DOPE FIEND

Insanity Expert Says He Could Find No Trace of the Drug Habit About Prisoner.

New York, Feb. 13.—The Thaw trial today was limited to an afternoon session of less than two hours' duration.

The morning sitting of court was abandoned because of the illness of the wife of one of the jurors, Joseph D. Bolton, No. 11. Mr. Bolton was allowed to visit his wife with two other jurors and two court officers.

He found his wife suffering from double pneumonia, and two eminent physicians certified before District Attorney Jerome that her condition was very serious.

Jerome then called on the jury panel in time for the afternoon session, which began at 2:10 p.m. and adjourned at 4:45 o'clock.

By stipulation of counsel the juror may again visit his home tonight, accompanied by bailiffs.

If Mrs. Bolton's condition continues to be so critical that she cannot give proper attention to his duties as a juror, there may be an indefinite postponement of the case, all the other jurors meanwhile being under guard, or possibly, a mistrial.

Everyone connected with the case expressed the hope tonight that events will permit of the trial being carried forward to a rapid conclusion.

Dr. Britton D. Evans, superintendent of the State Hospital for the Insane at Morris Plains, N. J., was the only witness this afternoon. His direct examination was finished, and District Attorney Jerome reserved the right to cross-examine the expert later in the trial.

Following a conference between counsel just before adjournment, Mr. Jerome announced that Thaw's attorneys had turned the will of the defendant over to him for examination before it should be formally offered in evidence.

Tomorrow Mr. Delmas will offer the will in evidence. If it is accepted, it will be read to the jury. If it is not objected by the consent of the district attorney there is likely to be an extended argument.

Following the disposition of the will Mrs. Evelyn Nesbit Thaw will resume the stand.

The evidence was resumed this afternoon, Dr. Evans being recalled.

"Doctor," began Mr. Delmas, "taking the facts gathered by you during the visits you made to Mr. Thaw, and taking the facts embodied in my hypothetical question, when did the manifestations of insanity take place?"

Mr. Jerome objected, whereupon Mr. Delmas took up the various points of the physical examination, one after another, asking Dr. Evans to explain the method and result of each.

Dr. Evans testified first that the general condition of Thaw's body as to nutrition was good. The condition of the skin also was good. The shape of the head showed no particular points of interest.

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were normal. The ankle reflexes were not abnormal."

Has Nervous Pulse
"He exhibited the most remarkable nervous pulse I have ever been given opportunity to examine. The pulse indicated a nervous control of the heart, showing the sympathetic nervous system to be at fault. The irregularity of the heart was evidenced by the pulse changing its rate four times within a minute, the variance being 12 to 14 beats. I have never known a pulse to change once in a minute."

He found no evidence of abnormal muscular co-ordination. A search for every drug habit was made, but none was found. Dr. Evans also declared that Thaw exhibited none of the tremors, as found in persons who have long been addicted to the use of intoxicants. No sign of disease of the spinal cord were found, nor were there found spots of anesthesia on the back and limbs.
