Meeting Broken Up by Noisy Gang At the Armories.

WERE POWERLESS

Temperance Speaker Finally Escorted To Ferry For Detroit.

[Soccial to The Advertiser.]

WINDSOR. April 11.—Hostile demonstrations prevented W. E. "Pussyfoot" Johnson, American prohibition advocate, speaking in the armories here tonight. Not only did the opposition to the "dry" forces drown out all attempts of the chairman, Dr. J. W. Brien of Windsor, and Rev. Dr. F. J. Oaten of Toronto, to address the gathering, but followed Mr. Johnson to the wharf, where police and friends hurried him aboard the ferry for Detroit amid the hisses and boos of a gathering of about 1,000, and a shower of missiles. "Goodby, Pussyfoot. Go home." were the parting shouts of the crowd.

Bricks Hurled.

A number of bricks were thrown at "Pussyfoot." while he was passing down Ouellette avenue, between Chatham and Pitt streets. One of the bricks struck Police Inspector Mort Wigle a glancing blow, while two other officers were also struck. At the dock the crowd was held back by the officers to allow "Pussyfoot" to board the ferry when the gangplank was hurriedly raised, Inspector Wirele accompanying Mr. Johnson to

Over 4,000 people crowded the armories, and from the time the meeting opened until it closed there was a continual din from all parts of the building. Police stationed in all sections were powerless to subdue the crowd, which, with cheers and singing and boos, kept up an unbroken attack on the platform. Even Chief of Police Thompson, who appeared on the platform and appealed to the audience to give a Canadian, Rev. O. C. Gray, a local minister, a chance to speak, was drowned out in the noise. out in the noise

Made No Attempt.

"Pussyfoot" Johnson did not enter the armories until shortly after 8 o'clock, when his appearance was greeted with cheers and booing This meeting was to have been the last he was to address in his Ontario tour for the "dry" forces, he having spoken in St. Thomas earlier in the day. He made no attempt to speak. Opposition was centred in the gallery at the back of the building, where the "wet" forces had been well erganized.

"The reception was all right, and was a regular bootleggers' convention," said Mr. Johnson to members of the press. "The drys say that the wets are disorderly, and the wets came tonight and proved it."

He stated that while he had quarrelled with a crowd in Kingston for some time, the opposition here was greater, while possibly not any more intense than in the eastern city. "It's a fine windup for my Ontario trip," he said. Mr. Johnson leaves for Columbus tomorrow.

Many Turned Away.

Long before the time of opening the building was crowded, and thousands were unable to gain admittance as the right wore on. The meeting opened by singing the National Anthem, led by the Salvation Army Band. Then Dr. Brien attempted to speak, but could not be heard owing to outbursts. A number of solos were rendered by a local singer, Slater Davidson. Rev. Dr. Oaten then made an effort to address the gathering, but when he could not get a hearing dicta, ed a statement to the members of the press.

APOLOGIZES FOR ENGAGING WINDLE

Col. Hendrie Says It Was An Error in Judgment.

HAMILTON. April 11. — Lieut.-Col. William Hendrie of this city, who introduced Charles A. Windle to the people of Hamilton last week, when Windle spoke under the auspices of the Citizens' Liberty League, has made a public apology in a statement in which he says that the Liberty League engaged Windle on his record in the Scottish fight between the prohibitionists and the antis, and did not learn of his anti-British propaganda in the United States until too late to prevent his Ontario tour.
