The executive committee of the Central Farmers' Institute held a meeting at the Walker House yesterday morning.

The meeting was for the purpose of arranging what subjects are to be brought up for discussion at the annual meeting of the Institute, which convenes on the second Thursday in February next.

The following order of paper was adopted: "World either preferential or free trade between the British Empire and her colonies be of advantage to the farmers of Ontario?"

"Resolved in the opinion of the members of the Central Farmers' Institute that the question of scientific agriculture should be one for certificates to qualify them as teachers for our public schools in a uniform manner and that no candidate who cannot successfully pass a satisfactory examination in agricultural chemistry should be granted a certificate to teach the youths of the rural section of the province."
