poses-A Warship Sent to Warn London, April 26 .- In the House of commons to-day Sir George Baden-Powell asked what steps had been taken by the overnment to notify sealers of the closing of Behring Sea, and whether the Governnent had permitted the seizure of vessels or arrest of commanders of vessels who had not received notification of the passage of he Behring Sea Act prior to sailing.

Her Majesty's ships had been sent to the scaling grounds to warn scalers of the provisions of the act, and any vessel violating the act would be liable to seizure. Mr. Bowles asked what had been done to sealers who had infringed upon the pro-
