

Can a housemaid's knee be cured? My mother has had one for three years. She always thought it was rheumatism.—N.

Answer—Bursitis or water on the knee comes to housemaids from constant pressure on the knee in scrubbing. Adhesive plaster applied firmly below and above the joint is helpful, but not for long. MEASLES EPIDEMIC

GROWS IN ONTARIO

TORONTO, July 2.—The epidemic of measles is increasing in Ontario, according to the reports from the provincial health department. There were 3.613 cases of measles reported in June, this being the second largest number in any one month for the past 20 years, with the exception of March, 1916, when there were over 5,000 cases, with 47 deaths.

The deaths last month totaled 22.
In May, 1920, there were 46 deaths from measles out of 2,264 cases. Smallpox is also on the increase, though no deaths were reported for June.

There were 349 smallpox cases reported for June, an increase of 59 over the previous month.


