



A FATHER'S EXPERIENCE IN TRAIN. ING CHILDREN. [From the Farming World].

I notice some very sensible talk from mothers in the ladies' department of your paper about the care and education of children. so far I have seen nothing from the fathers on the subject. My youngest child is eight and the oldest sixteen years of age. I can, therefore, speak from experience. Whether the knowledge of it imparted to others will profit them I cannot say. At any rate, if you will permit me a little space over in the ladies' column, I may get some good mother to give us a world of experience, and most likely I may receive a severe criticism at her likely I may receive a severe criticism at her hands. My course may have been wrong. It is hard for a parent to see the fault of the child, and it is often extremely difficult to tell just where the correction ought to come in, especially with the mother. In fact I have seen mothers who could or would not see scarcely a fault in somevery had children, although they were aware that their children are not as good as they might be; still they were ready to find excuses for them. To illustrate, a near relation of mine complained to me how bad and ungovernable her boys were. I ventured to agree with her, when she tossed her head to one side, cast her eye to the ceiling, and with an injured tone said: to the ceiling, and with an injured tone said:
"Well, I guess they're about as good as anybo ly's children." Hers, I imagine, were
about like Mrs. Jones' dear, sweet little Tominy, who minded her not a bit until his
mother's voice in a high key sung out, "You
Thomas Henry Jones," and then one might
have the near years an une coully freetful with know the poor woman was really fretted with a badly trained child. There is another, and here I must admit

fathers are most at fault. I have seen the

oyous play and chatter of children suddenly

cease almost to a deathly stillness at the ap-pearance of the father. A shake of his finger or a look, and they would shrink away to corners or disappear from his sight like scared mice. There is the severe, stately mother, too, with the keys hanging to her apron string and a switch in easy reach. Corporal punishment inflicted upon children is eruel and harbarous. Solomon's precept: "Spare the rod and spoil the child," was ap plicable in its day and to the people only addressed. The Jews, by their own history, were a stiff, wicked people, and never got a lick amiss. If children are to receive corporal punishment the father should never do it. His great, strong hand should never be raised for that purpose. Many children have been injured for life by a severe box on the car or a strong jerk by the arm. If it must be inflicted, lot it be always done by the mother. Having been raised by an old Virginia good mother, who ruled both white and black childthreshings inflicted on me never did the least good, but I had a continued sense of wrong. The humiliations was to me a yoke of oppression, and increased my desire to a robellion and waywardness. Again, the Sabbath was an unwelcome day. I was not allowed even to whistle on that day, opererise in any sport in or out of doors. Always to eat in perfect silerce, and remain silent in presence of visitation. tors. My wife and I have revised these rules in raising our children. Up to this time they have never been subjected to corporal punishment. We allow them to talk at table in a ishment. We allow them to talk at table in a moderate way, and to enjoy all the society that we enjoy. Visitors see as much of them as they do of the grown up ones. We make the children our companions. It is surprising to see how fast children will learn manners when constantly allowed the society of grown up people. Never talk baby talk to them, but the very best language at command. Intrust important business and duties to them as their years will permit, and make them feel that you impose confidence in their interrity




