

CANADIAN OBLIGATIONS

The verification of compliance will be under the control of an international Technical Secretariat which will be required to communicate with each designated National Authority with respect to data collection and transmittal, instrumental monitoring, and to international on-site inspections. The Technical Secretariat will have to designate each International Inspector in advance to each State Party, and it follows that each State Party will need to develop a mechanism for the approval of Inspectors to that State. In addition, circumstances could develop which would lead to a decision that a specific Inspector no longer be accredited, and again an appropriate procedure would be required. In the performance of their duties, it is likely that International Inspectors will be accompanied by State officials. The reports of such inspections will be made available to the State Party and will have to be reviewed. Facility attachments, in keeping with a model agreement, will have to be developed for inspection of schedule [2] facilities and of the single small scale facility. Officials of a State Party being inspected will have the right to examine the instruments used by the International Inspectors and may be called upon to provide equipment. There will be a requirement to make administrative arrangements for the International Inspectors on verification visits (e.g. make arrangements for travel and
