The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, today announced that in accordance with the agreement reached with the Hungarian Government in June, 1964 to establish diplomatic relations between the two countries, the Canadian Government has accredited to Budapest as non-resident Canadian Ambassador, Mr. Malcolm Norman Bow. Mr. Bow is concurrently accredited as Canadian Ambassador to Czechoslovakia.

Mr. Bow was born in Regina, Saskatchewan, on September 30, 1918. He was educated at the University of British Columbia and attended the summer session of the Academy of International Law, The Hague. He joined the Canadian Army in 1940, serving in the United Kingdom and the Far East, and was subsequently on the staff of the "Vancouver Daily Province" from 1946-1949. Mr. Bow became a member of the Department of External Affairs in 1949, served at Canadian diplomatic missions in New York, Madrid, and Havana, and was appointed Ambassador to Czechoslovakia in September, 1964. He is married and has four children.
